
Farnham is Rotarian of the Year

Profiles in Rotary – George Francis Collins, 1921 – 2004 EARLY DAYS - Excerpt from The Manoa Gang, published 12/15/2014



Our first house was on Lanihuli Drive at the top of Punahou Street in Mänoa. I remember a large bank of Mexican creepers (flowers) on the street side of the house. On the other side of the house was a lane with the Mänoa tennis courts just beyond. The Mexican creepers were full of bees, so of course I learned at an early age that bees sting!

My first recollection of a happening, even before I went to Miss Maxwell's preschool on Kewalo Street, was my being

thrown out of a car, through the windshield, as the result of an accident on the corner of Punahou and Wilder Streets. I was in my mother's lap, my father driving, when Dick razier's sister, who was intoxicated, drove across the street and banged into us. No safety glass or seat belts in those days. Dr. Alsup picked glass out of my head and wrapped the whole top of it up in gauze. The accident occurred at night and I could hardly wait for the next day to go out and show off my bandaged head to the neighbor17 hood.



KONA RESIDNET [ROTARIAN] HONORED FOR SUPPORT OF OTEC TECHNOLOGY (Article by West Hawii Today)



Kailua-Kona's Tom Daniel is the recipient of the distinguished third annual Uehara Prize for his contributions toward the development and support of Ocean Thermal Energy Conversion. OTEC is the technology for producing energy by harnessing the temperature differences between warm ocean surface waters and cold deep ocean waters.

Daniel recently received the distinguished award during the 8th International OTEC Symposium held virtually by the Institute of Marine Sciences and Limnology at the National Autonomous University of Mexico in Cancun.

The Uehara Prize was established in memory of the late OTEC pioneer, Professor Haruo Uehara of Japan's Saga University. Uehara was a repeat visitor to Kona's Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii Authority's (NELHA) Hawaii Ocean Science and Technology (Host) Park, long the world's premier location for OTEC research.

Daniel served as the scientific/technical director for NELHA 1982 to 2003 and collaborated with Uehara and other energy leaders in the development of NELHA's many OTEC projects.


She imparted a wealth of information and brought several informational flyers, brochures, and test kits so Club members could determine if they might have an infestation at home.






