



West Hawaii Mediation Center—continued

WHMC belongs to the Association for Conflict Resolution and National Association for Community Mediation. On the local front, WHMC participates in the Restorative Justice Consortium.

Deborah Chai, Executive Director, will talk a little about the history of the organizations, the services they offer to the community: mediation, facilitation, conflict resolution education, and training. She will go into a little more depth on mediation, what it entails, how to people come to mediation, and who our mediators are. In addition, she will discuss their school based conflict resolution education programs. Over 800 children last year in West Hawaii were served through these programs.

Deborah has been with the Center for 4 years, two years as its Case Manager, and the last two as its ED. She lives in Kalopa with her husband and 2 children, and is currently working on her Masters Degree in Psychology.

About The Rotary Foundation

Past President **Alan Clark** will be speaking to the club this week about The Rotary Foundation. For new members, this is an opportunity to learn about the Foundation and how it works. For those who are familiar with the Foundation, Alan will provide an update to recent changes made in how the funds are distributed.

The Rotary Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation that supports the efforts of Rotary International to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs. It is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world.

The Foundation was created in 1917 by Rotary International's sixth president, Arch C. Klumph, as an endowment fund for Rotary "to do good in the world." It has grown from an initial contribution of US\$26.50 to more than US\$117.9 million contributed in 2004-05. Its event-filled history is a story of Rotarians learning the value of service to humanity.

The Foundation's Humanitarian Programs fund international Rotary club and district projects to improve the quality of life, providing health care, clean water, food, education, and other essential needs primarily in the developing world. One of the major Humanitarian Programs is PolioPlus, which seeks to eradicate the poliovirus worldwide. Through its Educational Programs, the Foundation provides funding for some 1,200 students to study abroad each year. Grants are also awarded to university teachers to teach in developing countries and for exchanges of business and professional people. Former participants in the Foundation's programs have the opportunity to continue their affiliation with Rotary as Foundation Alumni.



The Daniel Robert Sayre Memorial Foundation was founded in 1998 to honor the life of Daniel Sayre who passed away after suffering a fall while hiking in the Kapaloa Falls in Pololu Valley on the Big Island. Although valiant rescue attempts from the fire rescue team were unsuccessful, Daniel's parents, Frank and Laura Sayre realized the importance of recognizing those employed by fire, rescue and emergency organizations.

Established to show appreciation for present day heroes and to raise money to purchase necessary supplies for rescue missions, the foundation along with the Hawaii Community Foundation holds a yearly awards banquet where outstanding rescue personnel are honored for their deeds. The Mayor, County Council, State Senate and State House of Representatives have joined the Sayre Family in presenting awards at the annual banquets. To date, the fund has raised more than \$200,000 to purchase necessary equipment such as deep valley rescue ropes, pulleys, cables, underwater scuba gear and underwater communications systems and training.

The Daniel Robert Sayre Memorial Foundation is a 501(c)3 foundation and all donations are tax deductible. All donations go directly to the Fire Department and not to administrative costs.



A TRAVEL ADVENTURE

(Ray Woods is a frequent visitor to the Rotary Club of Kona, and has been ou guest speaker on a couple of occasions. His emails of his travels will be copied from time to time with his permission)

Anyone who has traveled very much....perhaps especially in third world countries....has experienced some very unpleasant times. As I get older these times are fewer. This in part because lots of experience helps me deal with awkward situations. But I experienced a really Bad deal in Hainan. And it started at their modern airport. And modern it is! Like much of China today.

Hainan is an island south of Hong Kong and Macao. I knew it was well known as a playground for wealthy Chinese. Keep in mind Chinese come from many countries: 1,300,000,000 in China itself. But also in Singapore 3,500,000 of the 4,500,000 population is of Chinese descent....and a country with lots of money. Too, the countries of Southeast Asia have a percentage of Chinese....generally wealthy...have risen to the top of the money ladder.

Hainan Airport: I need help...help finding a hotel and a taxi to get me there. Soon I discover I am at the mercy of several very aggressive middle men...aggressively trying to talk to me in their limited English. I don't like these situations. So the sooner I can select a middle man the better. And I select one. But they all get in an outrageous argument. I firmly tell the others who I have selected. Actually the man had told me that he is the taxi driver. After some communication, a taxi pulls up with a woman driver...his friend...says it is his wife. But he is Not driving. And he gets in the back seat. And now seems like a pretty nice guy. He uses his cell phone to call a friend....who speaks better English. I am trusting....not much reason not to be. 45 minutes later we arrive at a beach hotel. He calls it a 5 star. Really a 3 or 4 star. But the golf course is top notch. Price \$82. Plus \$25 for 18 holes of golf with a caddy.

So now I am happy....made it to my destination...good hotel...and I will play golf...something I want to say I have done in communist China. All is well. But the story is just beginning. (to be continued...)

This week: Full Life Corporation

Full Life Corporation was founded in 1999 to provide support to people with developmental disabilities on the Big Island. The original idea for the founding of Full Life came about by a circle of friends working to determine how Curt Tyler, Jr.'s son could receive the services he needed. The Founders were Curt Tyler, Jr., Larry Casper and Deann Canuteson.

Deann's passion about people with developmental disabilities having the right to determine how they want to live their lives was the basis for creating Full Life. It is called "Self Determination" and the mission statement of Full Life is centered around this philosophy. Mr. Tyler firmly believed that his son should be supported around the things that gave him joy in life.

From this meager beginning, Full Life has grown from providing services to one man, to now providing an average of 290 hours per day or 2030 hours per week of face to face services and in June of 2006, opened the Learning Center in Kealakekua which provides day-time skills training and activities to adults with disabilities. Full Life has an office in Kealale-kua and Pahoa. Full Life employs close to 100 Big Island residents and will put over 3 million dollars into the Big Island economy this year.

Full Life is a 501(c) 3 not for profit corporation and donations are tax deductible.

Full Life is the beneficiary of the Big Island Celebrity Golf Classic to be held at Hokulia on October 23. In conjunction with the golf tournament is a dinner with silent and live auction to be held October 22 at the Sheraton Keauhou Bay Resort to raise funds for Full Life services. The second full day I arranged with James to go to the south of Hainan Island to see their beaches and big tourist area....lots of names hotels...Hilton, Sheraton, Novotel...I suggest my airport middle man who had given me his phone number. 8am Friday James, the middle man and a new driver, a man, and I head south. The agreed upon price is 800 Yuan...about \$100US. First we go to a bank where I get \$150 changed in to Chinese Yuan.

It takes nearly three hours to get to the beach.

I am not very hungry. James and I ate some street feet....didn't cost much but was quite tasty. The PROBLEM began there: The nice middle man and the driver had predetermined that that we would all eat at a fancy restaurant at my expense. The nice middle man immediately becomes very belligerent with James who speaks on my behalf. The middle man starts speaking in loud tones....and he is sitting right next to me....yelling across the table at James. No longer is he nice. He is now like he was when I first met him at the airport.

After listening to this for 15 minutes I decide we might as well go back. After all I am paying for this?

Once in the car the middle man again becomes aggressive with James....and we are several hours away from the hotel. As we enter the city of Hiakou the driver pulls over: And James is to get out. Yet I want to stay with James. By now I am not sure I trust these characters....the two I would be left with. But James says it will not be a problem. And he does get out. The middle man now becomes happier. And I can see my safety is not a problem.

So somewhere in this story lies some things I don't know about. After all the Chinese culture is quite different from my own. But some where the middle man failed to trust James....no matter what I said. Actually I did not say much. Usually these situations are ones I am on the sidelines watching....best to let them argue amongst themselves. But I did make it clear about me being with James and his being my friend. Fortunately I never lost my cool. And let things play themselves out. Back at the hotel the middle man told one of the supervisors his version. I made sure the supervisor heard my side."



Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions

The Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions was adopted by the Rotary International Council on Legislation in 1989 to provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for in the Object of Rotary:

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

- Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
- Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;
- Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
- Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public, and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
- Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society:
- Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession;
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.



September is <u>New Generations month</u>, and the Rotary Club of Kona is extremely proud of all that we have accomplished in the past, and are currently involved in, with the Interact Club at Kealakehe High School. With the STRIVE program underway, plans for RYLA coming together, and the Interact club activities, we have much to celebrate.

Part of New Generations is recruiting younger members to join our club. Following in an excerpt from this month's Rotarian Magazine on the subject:

A recent study shows that most Rotarians are between the ages of 50 and 59. Rotarians under 40 make up only 11 percent of overall membership.

"If we don't get enough young people into Rotary, then Rotary will die," RI President Bill Boyd told the newest regional Rotary International membership coordinators (RRIMCs) at their training seminar in March. "We take young people and give them that Rotaract experience and then tell them, Go away — come back in 10 years."

Youth program alumni rarely make the transition into Rotary, a pattern that many consider a missed opportunity. After all, participants in Interact, Rotaract, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, Rotary Youth Exchange, and Group Study Exchange are selected because they represent the best of the best in their age group. Many are sponsored by Rotarians or The Rotary Foundation to travel abroad, where they learn about the organization and develop exceptional leadership skills. About 84 percent of current RI and Foundation educational program participants say they would like to join Rotary someday. Still, most of them are not invited to join.

We will be joining with the "There are clubs that say at age 25, you can't be at the top," says Argentine RRIMC Modesta Genesio de Stabio, who hails from a region with a relatively high proportion of young Rotarians. "But you have to know who are the young leaders in your community and invite them into Rotary."

Although recruiting younger members is crucial to ensuring a strong future for Rotary, many RRIMCs point out that seasoned members are still the backbone of the organization. They bring both knowledge and resources to their clubs, and older members, especially retirees, often have more time than younger members to devote to service projects, not to mention a wealth of business savvy to pass on.

Because demographics and cultural norms vary by region, there's no single best way to attract younger members. But if you're concerned about the future of Rotary in your area, take a look at your local business community and compare it with your club. Do they reflect the same picture? If not, raise the issue with club leadership for discussion. Your club might consider supporting one of Rotary's youth programs or keeping better tabs on youth program alumni for future recruitment. Also, stay aware of volunteer trends, and keep an eye on other organizations in your region. Is there a young professionals group that potential Rotarians flock to over your club? Finally, try to picture your club 10 years from now. Who will be in charge? Will the club still be a pillar in your community? Get everyone involved in keeping your club relevant. After all, the next 100 years are up to you.

This week: Dr. Michael Graves

Michael Graves is the Chair and a Professor of the Anthropology Department at UH Manoa. He was trained at the Universities of Washington and Arizona; the latter is where he earned his doctorate in 1981. His specialization is in Pacific islands archaeology and studies the relationship between agricultural production and social organization.. He has worked in Hawaii for the past 20 years, and for the past 10 years has been studying heiau on Maui and now the Big Island. His work here has been preceded by nearly a decade of field work on the Kohala dryland field system, located in the uplands on a series of ranches--Parker, Kahua, and Ponoholo. This research has been supported by the National Science Foundation in a collaborative project with archaeologists, paleoecologists, and soil scientists working on Maui and Kohala to understand the dynamics of traditional dry land farming. As it turns out, ancient Hawaiians had developed or perfected a technique for growing copious amounts of sweet potato that took advantage of good volcanic soils, rich in nutrients, and moderate rainfall. A number of the heiau that Dr. Graves will talk about today are found in the uplands, providing an excellent link between religious practices and agriculture.



Judge Walter S. Kirimitsu was recently selected by the Board of Trustees of Saint Louis School, as the president and chief executive officer, and will be taking over for Father Allen deLong in the upcoming 2006-2007 academic year.

A proud and distinguished graduate of Saint Louis School, Judge Kirimitsu will become the first non-clergyman to lead Saint Louis School in its rich 160-year history.

Most recently, Judge Kirimitsu served as Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel to the University of Hawai'i (UH) system, where he advised the UH Board of Regents and UH president on matters having broad consequences on university policies, procedures and practices. This week: Dr. Earl Bakken



In 1949, Earl Bakken co-founded Medtronic, Inc., as a partnership with the late Palmer J. Hermundslie. Bakken was Medtronic's Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Board from the company's incorporation in 1957 until 1976. He was senior Chairman of the Board until his retirement as an officer of Medtronic in April 1989. As Founder and Director Emeritus, Bakken remains active in company relationships involving customers and employees, focusing primarily on the com-

pany's mission in the bioengineering industry as outlined in Medtronic's mission statement.

Born in 1924 in Minneapolis, Minnesota, Bakken was educated in the Columbia Heights public schools. He served four years in the United States Air Force as a radar maintenance instructor until 1946 when he enrolled at the University of Minnesota. After earning a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering degree in 1948, Bakken studied electrical engineering with a minor in mathematics at the University of Minnesota Graduate School.

Bakken developed the first wearable, external, battery-powered, transistorized pacemaker in 1957 for Dr. C. Walton Lillehei, a University of Minnesota heart surgeon. He has authored several professional papers and delivered numerous speeches to medical, technical, educational and business groups throughout the world.

In 1975 he founded The Bakken, a nonprofit library, museum, and education center devoted to the history of electricity and magnetism and their uses in medicine and the life sciences. The Bakken's collection of rare books and antique instruments and devices has grown to be the finest of its kind in the world. The education programs of The Bakken are renowned for their integration of hands-on learning, history, and the arts.

In retirement, Bakken has been actively supportive of many groups in Northwest Hawaii that support the health and well being of its 30,000 people. These include North Hawaii Community Hospital, Friends of the Future, Five Mountains Hawaii, North Hawaii Outcomes Project, The Kohala Center, and Na Kalai Waa Moku O Hawaii.



This week: Hire net Hawaii

HireNet Hawaii is a first-of-its-kind integrated employment matching system that provides Hawaii's employers and jobseekers with access to the most advanced and comprehensive job-matching system in the state, revolutionizing the way in which Hawaii businesses hire employees. Since HireNet Hawaii's roll out on July 27, 2006, the state's leading employment matching system has attracted over 6,500 new job seekers and 436 employers looking to fill 3,589 postings of available jobs. Additionally, 1,306 resumes have been posted on the system for review by potential employers. HireNet Hawaii allows jobseekers to post their resumes online and search for all available jobs in Hawaii, with a search engine that "spiders" company and government websites, newspaper postings, and corporate job boards for employment opportunities in Hawaii. They can register on this new secure system, match their skills with occupations, search job postings, research occupational wages and industry trends, and create custom occupational profiles from their queries. Employers are able to post their job openings, at no cost, and search for candidates to fill their employment needs. Employers can also use HireNet Hawaii for recruitment and educational services, download required employment posters, review Labor Laws, and connect to the DLIR's Workforce Development Division.

Rotary honors the Grand-Duc Henri of Luxembourg for supporting a polio-free world

In recognition of his country's outstanding financial contribution to polio eradication, Rotary International honored Grand-Duc Henri of Luxembourg for his personal commitment to the cause.

During a special event at the Grand Ducal Palace, Rotary Foundation Trustee Rudolf Hörndler presented Grand-Duc Henri with a framed bas relief depicting a child receiving the polio vaccine. Hörndler said, "On behalf of the 1.2 million members of Rotary around the world, and equally important, on behalf of the millions of children you will never meet, I wish to acknowledge your personal contribution to protecting children from polio."

Luxembourg remains the highest per capita donor to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. This year, the government committed US\$3.70 million for the next three years. The country's total contribution stands at US\$9.08 million.

As Grand-Duc Henri is the Honorary President of all Luxembourg Rotary Clubs, Hörndler also presented him with Rotary's 3-Ruby stone Paul Harris Fellow + 8 pin, which is the highest level awarded by the Foundation. The Grand Duc Henri is the first member of royalty to receive this recognition.

A highly infectious disease that can cause paralysis and sometimes death, polio still strikes children in parts of Asia, Africa and the Middle East. To date, the number of polio cases has been reduced from 350,000 children annually in the mid 1980s to approximately 2,000 cases all last year. Only 4 countries: Nigeria, India, Pakistan and Afghanistan, are still polio-endemic — an all-time low.

Rotary's commitment to end polio represents the largest private-sector support of a global health initiative ever. In 1985, Rotarians worldwide vowed to immunize all the world's children against polio. Since then, Rotary has contributed more than US\$600 million to the effort. Besides raising and contributing funds, over one million men and women of Rotary have volunteered their time and personal resources to help immunize more than 2 billion children in 122 countries during national immunization campaigns.





EARTHQUAKE ASSISTANCE INFORMATION

Hawaii County Civil Defense has set up a hotline phone number to handle calls reporting structural damage resulting from Sunday's earthquakes and to record requests for inspections.

Residents and business owners can call 935-0031 between the hours of 7:45 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Callers will be asked for the following information:

- The address of the damaged property. No post office boxes.
- A contact phone number and best time to call
- Clear directions to the home or business

Depending on the number of calls and requests for assistance, response time to visually inspect damages may be between five and seven days. Life-threatening and major structural damage will be given first priority.

Examples of major damage include:

- Post and pier structures that have shifted off their foundations or posts have crumbled.
- Structures that have fallen off their foundations and are in danger of sliding into a gulch
- Structures with gas leaks
- Structures where chimneys have fallen in or wood burning stoves have moved

Other reasons for inspection, that may be given a lower priority, are buildings with broken water lines or other plumbing damage, fallen rock walls that are not blocking roadways or post and pier structures that have shifted, but not fallen.

Because all available County employees are responding to the aftermath of the earthquakes, the building division of Public Works has suspended issuing or building permit application processing and all inspections for electrical, plumbing and buildings through Monday, October 23, 2006.



MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT BILL



New class of Rotary Peace and Conflict Studies participants announced

(BANGKOK, ----) -- Rotary International has selected 22 professionals from 13 countries to study in a new program that teaches theoretical perspectives and practical skills surrounding conflict resolution and mediation. The Rotary Peace and Conflict Studies Program , a three-month curriculum taught at Chulalongkorn University, aims to build conflict resolution skills for promising leaders and professionals who work in fields involving conflict resolution and mediation.

The program offers an intensive curriculum developed by international and regional experts on peace and conflict studies. It is aimed at upper-level professionals in governments, non-governmental organizations, private corporations, academia, and media agencies. Participants are selected twice a year in a globally competitive selection process based on their professional and academic achievements.

Like the members of the inaugural class, the 22 new participants who begin studies in January 2007 are a diverse group, representing a wide array of professional backgrounds. Their interests and areas of expertise include education, human rights, public health, armed forces, public policy, economic development, and social justice. For example:

Krishna Adhikari, of Nepal, works for National Human Rights Commission in Lalitpur, Nepal. Giovanni Contarin, of Italy, is a director of HIV/AIDS care in Rayong at Saint Camillus of Thailand

Maarifa Vincent Ndekezi, of Rwanda, is a resource person in the corporate experiential program and an English language teacher at Green Hills Academy in Rwanda.

Dunesh Harsha Gankanda, of Sri Lanka, is a member of parliament from Ratnapura District and a director of DKD Holding Co. Ltd.

Shaohua Gu, of China, is the Third Secretary of Organization and Personal Department at Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs in Beijing.

Lynne Favinger, of the United States, is an executive director of the Central Mediation Center in Nebraska.

Hasmukhumar Patel, of India, is the superintendent of Police for the Government of Gujarat. Francis Kabosha, of Zambia, is a refugee officer for the Commissioner for Refugees' Office (COR), Zambia



The Rotary Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation that is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world.

The Foundation was created in 1917 by Rotary International's sixth president, Arch C. Klumph, as an endowment fund for Rotary "to do good in the world." It has grown from an initial contribution of US\$26.50 to more than US\$117.9 million contributed in 2004-05. Its event-filled history is a story of Rotarians learning the value of service to humanity.

The Foundation's Humanitarian Programs fund international Rotary club and district projects to improve the quality of life, providing health care, clean water, food, education, and other essential needs primarily in the developing world. One of the major Humanitarian Programs is PolioPlus, which seeks to eradicate the poliovirus worldwide. Through its Educational Programs, the Foundation provides funding for some 1,200 students to study abroad each year. Grants are also awarded to university teachers to teach in developing countries and for exchanges of business and professional people. Former participants in the Foundation's programs have the opportunity to continue their affiliation with Rotary as Foundation Alumni.







- Rotary's longtime commitment to Community Service makes it imperative for Rotarians to actively address the crisis in the family today;

 - a) bring their power to bear through existing programs on the most formidable problems facing families today, including but not limited to domestic violence, child abuse and neglect, homelessness, drug and alcohol abuse, gang activities, child-care needs, and underemployment;
 - instill the importance of universal human values in the homes, schools and communities of the world;
 - c) continue current projects and undertake new ones that strengthen the family structure and make it a secure anchor for the larger community;
 - d) demonstrate their commitment to family and community through projects, activities, and events in celebration of "Family Month" each year. (July 03, Nov. 95)





THIS WEEK: WHAT IS A MECHANICAL COW?

They are not black and white; they do not munch hay; and they certainly do not "moo". They do however share one very important feature with their bovine counterparts—they produce large quantities of milk.

The term "mechanical cow" is used to refer to the machines that convert the cheap, plentiful crops of soybeans grown in many Third World countries, into soymilk. In addition to being cheap to produce and not requiring refrigeration, soy milk is high in protein and nutrients that many children in Third World countries lack.

In 1985, a Canadian scientist discovered a way to make soy milk palatable, and a start up grant from the Canadian International Development Agency established a company to develop his idea.

The stainless steel machine comes in various sizes, with the smallest unit standing about 2 feet tall. Operated with a

manual or electric boiler, the machine can produce 20 liters of soy milk per hour.



One of the four Rotary Club of Kona Community Foundation Scholarships is called the "Jim and Sis Bedingfield Scholarship" in honor of one of our long time club Members who were very involved in the Foundation and with youth in the community. This years recipient is Michael DeBois who was awarded \$1,000 per year for four years.

"School has started back up again and even though this is only the first week, I'm already excited with what classes I was able to get. After taking Creative Writing 263, the instructor invited me into his senior-level course, Fiction Writing 431, which I found to be such an honor. He let me in even while I had not taken two of the three pre-req classes, and now I am amongst a crowd of English majors, all seniors and higher, which is very, very exciting (if not a little intimidating at the same time!)

I also am taking Survey of Psychology 100, Cultural Anthropology 100, and Social Ethics (really interesting!) 220. The schedule I have arranged for myself is very nice, as my first class does not start until 4 on Monday, and my last one on Thursday ends at 1:30, giving me a chance to come home that night. It does total up to 12 credits, while also giving me a chance to work 20 hours a week at the Sheraton Resort on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday nights, and return to school on Monday afternoon. The pay is good out there, and I'm looking at about making \$70 to \$100 a night, which will really help with paying off college as soon as possible.

Currently, I have a 3.76 GPA, which I am very thankful for as well (took a lot of hard work!). Again, thank you guys so much and I look forward to hearing from you!"

ROTARY THEME FOR 2007—2008 ANNOUNCED

The 2007-08 theme "Rotary Shares" will act as a daily reminder of what ordinary people can accomplish through the extraordinary work of Rotary, said RI President-elect Wilfrid J. Wilkinson at the 2007 International Assembly's opening session today.



"What makes Rotary great is our expressing the love in our hearts through the work of our hands and our minds," said Wilkinson. "As Rotarians, we don't just sit back and talk about loving other human beings. As Rotarians, we demonstrate that love, and we share that love, through helping each other."

Almost everything Rotary does involves sharing, Wilkinson told the 532 district governors-elect gathered at the meeting in San Diego. "We share our time, we share our talents, and we share our money with others who need our help."

Furthermore, he said, "In Rotary, sharing doesn't mean giving away what you have to spare, what you don't need for yourself. Sharing means giving of yourself, selflessly, for the good of others."

And Rotarians don't need to do this alone. They know that when the need for service in their community can't be met by one club alone, they can call on Rotarians from around the world to help, said Wilkinson.

More than a theme, Rotary Shares is a call to action. As the incoming governors begin preparing for the year ahead with the training and inspiration they receive at the International Assembly, Wilkinson asked them to focus on sharing their leadership, skills, and dedication to making clubs and districts stronger.

Sharing Rotary does more than strengthens Rotary; it ensures that Rotary continues a second century of service. Rotary Shares means inviting people to join their local Rotary clubs.

"Rotary will only be able to continue sharing if it continues to grow," said Wilkinson. To help Rotary grow, Wilkinson requested that all of the incoming governors ask their club presidents to bring in one new club member during their year in office.

"Without new members, nothing else matters," he said. Without our youth and new members, "it will only take a few decades for Rotary to disappear, and we've already seen that happen in other service clubs."

In addition to the crucial job of welcoming new club members, the president-elect said Rotarians should not forget their past. He asked them to reach out to former club members, including club members' widows and widowers.

Wilkinson reminded the audience that the opportunities they'll have to help may not come their way again.

"This year is your chance to be a district governor, to help your clubs, to guide them, to share your strengths and your love."

In the year ahead, a great deal will be asked of Rotarians, said Wilkinson.

"I ask you all, this year, to share Rotary freely and fully. Work hard, and work with love. And remember that everything you do in service to others is part of the magic of Rotary, the magic that allows ordinary people, like you and me, do absolutely amazing things."



Over the last several years, the Kaniohale Community Association (KCA) Board has been working with the Department of Hawaiian Homelands (DHHL) and the County of Hawaii to provide a multi purpose community center for the Villages of La'iōpua and the surrounding Kealakehe ahupua'a communities. The proposed La'iōpua Community Center will provide sorely needed educational, recreational, social, cultural, and medical/dental programs and services within the Kealakehe District.

MARCH: LITERACY MONTH

Rotarians empower Guatemala's children with books, computers

S. Rotarian Glenn Chamberlain has traveled to Guatemala 11 times since 2000. His visits are supporting a decade-old literacy project that is helping impoverished schookhildren sharpen their reading and computer skills.

A member of the Rotary Club of Ephrata, Washington, Chamberlain travels to the country's poor rural areas to identify schools that can benefit from the self-sustaining Guatemala Literacy Project, or GLP. Months later, he returns with a team of Rotarians and other volunteers to deliver the needed textbooks, computers, and other supplies. More than 260 Rotary clubs in North and Central America support the project, in partnership with the

U.S.-based nonprofit Cooperative for Education.

"We are targeting the Mayan population, who are the poorest of the poor," says Chamberlain, who is one of the project's coordinators. "The vast number of people living in the country have no electricity and indoor plumbing. Without literacy, they will never be able to have a better life."

Torn by three decades of civil war, Guatemala has been suffering from one of the highest illiteracy rates in the Western Hemisphere. A 2003 study by the World Bank found an illiteracy rate as high as 60 percent in rural Guatemala, compared to the country's overall rate of 30 percent.



But that's changing. The GLP has cut the dropout rate in half at participating schools, according to a 2005 study by Marroquin University in Guatemala City. The yearlong study of 10 schools notes that students "experiencincreased interest in their schoolwork as a result of having access to books," allowing them to study at home.

Since the GLP started in 1996, Rotarians and their partners have delivered more than 120,000 math, science, language, and social studies textbooks to about 23,500 Spanish-speaking students in 135 schools. The project has also established 17 mini-libraries and 16 computer centers, which are providing 8,700 high school students with the skills they need to secure technology-based jobs that

will lift them out of poverty.

Chamberlain says the GLP owes its longevity to strong Rotarian support and the project's self-sustaining system. Each student pays a small annual fee to rent four textbooks and use a computer center. The money is placed in a five-year revolving fund that is used to replace worn-out books and equipment.

The project's success has attracted other donors, including Microsoft, which in April presented a US\$255,000 grant for computers and software.



This week: Ben Franklin, The Rotary Club of Kona and the Big Island

Mike O'Donnell is the new Dean of Continuing Education and Community Service at the University of Hawaii Hilo. His presentation today will be on two things; the Osher Lifelong learning Institute, and offering continuing education courses to more Big Island communities. Two years ago, UHH received a grant from the Bernard Osher Foundation to provide courses and programs to adults 45 years of age and older. This is the start of the grant's third and final year. He will describe course offerings, distribute course catalogs, and recruit Osher Lifelong learning memberships. If OLLI enrolls 500 members by the end of the year, UHH is eligible for a \$1 million endowment grant from the Bernard Osher Foundation. Interest on the endowment grant will provide \$50,000-\$70,000 a year for Big Island continuing education courses over the next 2 or 3 hundred years. He would also like to ask club members what UHH courses and programs are needed in their respective communities.

Joining us this week will be Diane Chadwick of Hawaii Community Foundation; Beth Mehau, executive director, West Hawaii Habitat for Humanity; Linda Petrucelli, full-time case manager for the earthquake recovery effort with WHVOAD and Glenn Doss, Salvation Army Kona Corps.

Two very lively community meetings were held at The Salvation Army Kona Corps Community Center in December 2006 which led to the formation of an alliance of a dozen local agencies, churches, and other organizations. The West Hawaii Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (WHVOAD) was inaugurated to help ensure that people victimized by the October 15, 2006, disaster are restored to the same level of sufficiency at which they were prior to the earthquake. The governor has asked the Hawaii Community Foundation to steward a \$323,000 earthquake recovery grant which is being funneled to the point of need through the WHVOAD.

To date the two WHVOAD case managers, Linda Petrucelli and Janet Murray, have processed 119 client cases. This week: AIRPORT MASTER PLAN

Joining us this week will be Chauncey Wong-Yuen, Hawaii Airports District Manager, who is going to inform us of the Airport Master Plan and Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study.

An airport master plan provides strategic guidance for airport facilities and infrastructure development to support current and future aviation demands. The Master Plan for Kona International Airport will review and update long range forecasts for airport development over the next 20 years.

A Noise Compatibility Study guided by Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 150, will be conducted at the same time as the Master Plan Study. The Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study will develop current and future noise exposure contours for Kona International Airport. In addition, it will provide a plan that outlines specific approaches to managing airport noise and encourages compatible land use.

The current Kona Airport Master Plan was completed in 1998. However, changes in the aviation industry and federal regulations necessitate a re-examination of the development plan. The new Master Plan is being prepared to provide a comprehensive development strategy for Kona International Airport for decades to come.

Chauncey Wong Yuen will talk about the objectives of the master plan and the Noise Compatibility Program; why the studies are being conducted; how they are being conducted; when they will be completed; and how residents can participate.

Our Primary mission: to restore and keep up the Camp Tarawa Memorial as well as keeping alive the history of the men of the 2nd and 5th Marine Divisions who trained there from December 1943 until the Camp was finally closed for good in November 1945.

REVISED ROTARY CLUB OF KONA BYLAWS

Members of the Rotary Club of Kona,

A committee chaired by President-elect Diane Ilstrup was established by the 2006-2007 Rotary Club of Kona Board of Directors to review and recommend revisions to the club's current Constitution and Bylaws. The purpose of this sixmonth process was to update our governing documents to be in line with the present Rotary International (RI) constitution and RI suggested bylaws. All Rotary Cubs must accept the Rotary International Constitution without revision. Our club was using a constitution that was not up to date. Furthermore, our Bylaws did not reflect changes made to either the current constitution or the suggested Bylaws from RI. Rotary International has a template for club bylaws, which can be modified for each individual club as long as the bylaws adopted reflect the current RI constitution. We decided to modify them to fit our clubs needs. To avoid this situation in the future, the proposed bylaws contain a provision requiring review every year.

This email contains attachments of both the proposed bylaws and a copy of the most recent constitution as required by Rotary International. If you are not able to the access email, please contact Secretary Dick Fearing and he will provide you a hard copy of the information you require.

Major proposed changes include:

- * The addition of a vice-president to the officers and board. The current bylaws provide for the president-elect serving as vice-president.
- * This addition adds a member to the board of directors.




Lew will be leading the GSE Team as they make their way to the Island of Hawaii, where their trip will culminate with the District Conference here in Kona on the May long weekend.



REVISED ROTARY CLUB OF KONA BYLAWS

Members of the Rotary Club of Kona,

A committee chaired by President-elect Diane Ilstrup was established by the 2006-2007 Rotary Club of Kona Board of Directors to review and recommend revisions to the club's current Constitution and Bylaws. The purpose of this sixmonth process was to update our governing documents to be in line with the present Rotary International (RI) constitution and RI suggested bylaws. All Rotary Cubs must accept the Rotary International Constitution without revision. Our club was using a constitution that was not up to date. Furthermore, our Bylaws did not reflect changes made to either the current constitution or the suggested Bylaws from RI. Rotary International has a template for club bylaws, which can be modified for each individual club as long as the bylaws adopted reflect the current RI constitution. We decided to modify them to fit our clubs needs. To avoid this situation in the future, the proposed bylaws contain a provision requiring review every year.

This email contains attachments of both the proposed bylaws and a copy of the most recent constitution as required by Rotary International. If you are not able to the access email, please contact Secretary Dick Fearing and he will provide you a hard copy of the information you require.

Major proposed changes include:

- * The addition of a vice-president to the officers and board. The current bylaws provide for the president-elect serving as vice-president.
- * This addition adds a member to the board of directors.
- * Member annual dues and fees: Recommendations by the Board of Directors to change the dues and/or club fees would require approval by the membership.
- * Some board business may be done via email providing that the next board minutes reflect what was done.
- * Committees have been defined and added.

We will be voting on the new constitution and proposed bylaws **TODAY** at our regularly scheduled Rotary meeting.







K. Angel Pilago, 59, is a native of Hawai'i and has been a resident of Kona for over 20 years. Married to Nita Pilago, they have 2 sons and 4 grandchildren. All are active in community, social, and civic affairs, promoting family values and advocating for a secure quality of life for Hawai'i.

K. Angel Pilago is a US Army 101st Airborne Division Veteran earning numerous decorations in Vietnam including the Silver Star for Heroism. He received his diploma while in service, obtained an Honorable Discharge, and attended University of Hawai'i majoring in Social Science. He has 20 years experience as an Employment Counselor with the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations gainfully engaged in Economic Development and Community Service.



Striving to be involved and contributing to make Hawai'i a better place to live, he was instrumental and successfully led the 2 landmark Supreme Court Civil Rights cases Kohanaiki-PASH, and, Ka Pa'akai v. LUC. These legal victories led to new laws in the state of Hawai'i that provide strong tools to ensure environmental justice, human rights and public use of resources.

As Executive director of the Kohanaiki 'Ohana, Mr. Pilago exhibited exceptional abilities to establish partnerships for coalition building. He initiated innovative programs empowering the community to take an active role in land stewardship. His resolve has led a new generation to protect traditional practices, natural resources, history and values. These projects built partnerships between students, landowners, businesses and governmental agencies and led to the recent developer agreement to create a shoreline park at Kohanaiki dedicated to the public.

K. Angel Pilago's community service includes: Kailua Village Design Commission, Historic Hawai'i Foundation, Kaloko-Honokohau Commission, Hawai'i Historic Preservation Council, Polynesian Voyaging Society, and other distinguished organizations. His awards and commendations include: "Malama Aina Award" bestowed by Congresswoman Patsy Mink, "National Wetlands Award" given by the Environmental Law Institute and the Environmental Protection Agency, "Five Star Restoration Award" bestowed by the National Association of Counties, The Governor Ben Cayetano Certificate for "Keeping Hawai'i Beautiful," and numerous other acknowledgments of service and recognition of merit.

Mr. Pilago has a long history of community organizing to protect Hawaii's fragile natural and cultural resources. His commitment, dedication and effective community organizing on the local level, political lobbying on both the state and national levels has proven successful at creating long lasting social change.


