

cross section of society. The Arc of Kona is committed to helping persons with disabilities achieve the fullest possible independence and participation in our society according to their wishes.

Prior to 1962, no program existed on the Kona Coast to provide care, training, or even concern for children and adults with significant disabilities. Institutionalization was routinely recommended, and it was not uncommon for those who remained at home to be kept hidden and not discussed outside the family.

In 1962, a group of local residents, led by Dr. Kid "Doc" McCoy held a meeting to focus on the need for a locally operated program to serve the disabled. The Kona Chapter of the Big Island Association to Help Retarded Citizens (BIAHRC) was formed with Doc McCoy as its President. Assisting Doc, was Mark Sutherland. four months later, the first classes were held at Christ Church's Wallace Hall. A rehabilitation workshop and a sheltered workshop were added in 1965.

In 1966, the Kona Chapter of HIAHRC formally adopted the name of Kona Krafts for its workshop and management board. Yash Deguchi was hired as its Executive Director, a position he held for over 20 years. The Kona Center for Retarded Children moved to the upstairs room of the old Kona Fire Station, and Kona Krafts established itself on the ground floor.

Ground was broken for our present facility in 1969 and was completed in 1970. In November 1984, our Group Home in Captain Cook was blessed and dedicated. In 2005, we added another dba: The Arc of Kona.

The Arc of Kona has grown and changed over the years, but our main goal for the future is to accelerate the shift in emphasis from a sheltered workshop to a competitive employment center. We strive to educate and support families in their efforts to advocate for the integration of their children or siblings into the mainstream of our society.

Today, the Arc of Kona is an accredited rehabilitation facility providing assurance of the highest quality care.





Dong Kurn Lee to become the first Korean to head Rotary International

(EVANSTON, Ill., USA, July 1, 2008) – Dong Kurn Lee, president of Bubang Co. Ltd in South Korea, took office on July 1 as president of Rotary International, a volunteer service organization with more than 1.2 million members in more than 200 countries and geographical areas.



In addition to reducing childhood mortality, Lee is also dedicated to the global effort to eradicate polio, Rotary's top priority. He has traveled around the world, including India, to immunize children against the crippling and potentially fatal disease which still threatens children in parts of Africa and South Asia. Since the launch of Rotary's PolioPlus program in 1985, Rotary members have helped to immunize more than two billion children in 122 countries. As the lead private sector contributor and volunteer arm of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative – a public/private partnership spearheaded by the World Health Organization, Rotary International, US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and UNI-CEF – Rotary has contributed US\$700 million and countless volunteer hours to the cause.

Rotary's recent funding agreement with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation will provide another US\$200 million toward ending polio over the next three years - another milestone in Rotary's 20-year legacy of polio eradication work.

Lee will emphasize three other major humanitarian issues: literacy, hunger relief, and clean water. During his one-year term, Lee will encourage Rotary clubs around the world to partner with local governments and non-governmental organizations to initiate projects that improve literacy rates and provide sustainable sources of food and clean water to communities in developing countries.

A graduate of Yonsei University with a degree in political science and diplomacy, Lee currently serves as Trustee to the Busan College of Information Technology and has served as past president of both his high school and college alumni associations. He has served as a Trustee to the bank of Seoul and honorary consul of Italy in Korea. In 2005, he was appointed as International Goodwill Ambassador by the President of the Republic of Korea.

Lee joined the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hangang in 1971 and has served Rotary International as board director and Rotary Foundation trustee. He was chairman of the Polio Eradication Private Sector Initiative in Korea.

Near the end of his term, Lee will host Rotary's 2009 international convention, set for June 21-24 in Birmingham, UK. The convention is expected to draw about 20,000 Rotary members from around the world.



BOSTON, 1933 RADIO ADDRESS BY PAUL HARRIS

Chesley Perry, general secretary, Rotary International: "Twenty-eight years ago the first Rotary Club was started in Chicago by a lawyer who though born in the Middle-West, was brought up in New England.

It was his idea to have a group of men of every line of business and profession who should in the spirit of the "Golden Rule" - practice friendship and cooperation. From that club has grown the

> world's movement of Rotary. That Chicago lawyer - who still lives in Chicago, is here tonight. And it is now my privilege and honor to present him to you. I introduce to you all Paul P. Harris"

"Friends of the air. It is a real privilege to address you. We are gathered together in Boston from almost every civilized country of the world. We come from the British Isles, China, Japan, European and South American countries, Australia, New Zealand, and many others.

More than forty nations are represented and some of the delegates will have circled the globe on the return to their native countries. It is a most inspiring occasion.

In the present to this gathering, my mind very naturally reverts to that first meeting which was held in Chicago 28 years ago. Four of us were in attendance: Mighty Oaks, from Little Acorns Grow.

Perhaps there are 2 features of Rotary which more than any others challenge the attention of those who are not Rotarians.

One is what we call our classification plan by virtual bridge. Membership in Rotary is limited to one representative of each line of trade or profession.

The other is the provision that neither riches, political nor religious standings shall constitute barriers to membership.

To these two provisions, Rotary is thrown open to representatives of all walks of life.

To representatives of all countries and all forms of religion.

Would this mean to open the door to all manner of discord? One might think so. In fact many have said that human ingenuity could hardly divide a plan of organization more fraught with peril. Here in lies the genius and the Rotary, the glory of Rotary.

The formula of procedure is indeed simple. Why Rotarians differ in many respects - in two respects they are in perfect accord.

First they believe that all nations are respectable and desire to be honorable in their dealings with other nations. That it is the privilege of all men to worship God according to the dictates of their own conscience. In other words Rotary stands for TOLERANCE.

Second they believe, that all honorable vocations are entitled to recognition if they are used in the

service of society.

With these signs of agreement firmly established, disagreement is almost unknown.

Rotary emphasizes the points of agreement and avoids controversial issues.

Rotary thus becomes the common denominator, the sanctuary to which all are welcome.

Is there any valid reason why catholic and protestant, Jew and gentile should not enjoy friendly intercourse?

Where it is done in rotary, catholic priests, Jewish rabbis and protestant ministers sit side by side in happy fellowship at Rotary Club meetings. Even if travels take you to India there you may meet Mohammedans, Hindus and Christians, breaking bread together. Is this not as it should be?

Remember the words: Peace, honor, goodwill toward all men.

To put it readily: Rotary is trying to make the words of Robert Burns come true:

You remember that: The time will come for all of us where man to man shall Brother be for a'that.

Those outside the membership frequently ask the question.

How did it come about? That's a hard question to answer.

One answer would be that Rotary's popular appeal is due to the fact that In Rotary men are encouraged to be natural. Just to be themselves. In this world were artificiality so abounds, it is refreshing to meet with groups who are not worshippers of cold meaningless formalities.

Further there is a bit of the boy in every man, and friendly natural intercourse is the best way to bring it out.

I wished it might be your privilege, as it is mine tonight, to look in on this happy throng of big strong men from occident and orient from the frozen north and from down beneath the equator .

Many of them have their wives with them and the faces of all our radiance with smiles as they clasped each others' hands. If you were here I believe that you would agree with me in my conclusion that the words of the Bard of Ayr were not the expression of an idle dream, that they were indeed prophetic and that the finest conception of human mind the conception of universal goodwill and peace will in God's good time be realized in very truth.

Rotary in a final analysis is a way of life, of a good, natural, wholesome friendly way of life.

The world is full of potential Rotarians who are not Rotarians in fact.

Many of them are listening to me now.

If you have the love of your fellowmen in your heart my friends, you are potential Rotarians.





Harbors Modernization Plan

As an Island State, Hawai'i relies heavily on our commercial harbors and imported cargo to meet the demands of our residents, businesses and visitors. Hawai'i's commercial harbors are shared-use facilities through which passengers and 98% of Hawai'i's imported goods pass, including consumer goods, vehicles, fuel and constructional materials. To ensure the continued and unimpeded movement of cargo in and out of the State, as well as between our Islands, our harbors must undergo major expansion and improvements to assure their efficiency and capability.

DOT Harbors Division, in partnership with members of the Hawai'i Harbors User Group, has developed a system-wide harbor modernization plan which will implement harbor infrastructure improvements to address projected increases in ocean transportation of cargo and passengers through the year 2030.

The Big Island of Hawai'i has two commercial harbors, Hilo and Kawaihae. Hilo is the island's busier port handling cargo and passengers. Kawaihae on the island's northwest side is served by Matson and Young Brothers, as well as bulk barges. It is also the harbor used to ship Big Island cattle to market. The Big Island has experienced a population growth of 31.5 percent increase in the last 15 years. The plan includes the following projects:

- Dredging, construction of a new pier and inter-island cargo handling yard through a new Pier 4 barge terminal in Hilo
- Acquisition of property to establish a third harbor access via Kumao Street which will allow for traffic separation between commercial and cruise ship activity
- Expansion of barge and terminal improvements at Pier 2 at Kawaihae Harbor
- A southern extension of Pier 2 to provide additional overseas operational area at Kawaihae Harbor
- Construction of a multi-use Pier 4 at Kawaihae Harbor
- Site improvements to allow the development of liquid bulk storage facilities at Kawaihae Harbor

Rotarians chip in to distribute dust masks



Rotarians in Northern California, USA, handed out thousands of dust masks as smoke from the state's worst wildfire outbreak in years continued to pose a health threat to residents.

Earlier this month, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger highlighted the severity of the situation as firefighters battled more than 2,000 blazes affecting over 900,000 acres, according to the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection.

"It's very important to note that up until recently, we had a fire season, which meant that late summer throughout the fall we had the fire season," Schwarzenegger said in a briefing. "Now there is no more fire season. There are fires all year around."

Rotarians in Oroville and Gridley spent the weekend of 12-13 July as "smokefighters," handing out more than 1,200 dust masks to evacuees in shelters and hospitals. Later in the week, Brian Moore, governor of District 5180, coordinated more giveaways in shopping centers and on street corners with Rotarians in District 5160.

Highly rated

The masks have a rating of N95, meaning they filter out 95 percent of particulate matter, more than surgical masks, according to Dr. Matthew Fine, chief medical officer at Oroville Hospital. That degree of filtration blocks dangerous materials carried from burning vegetation.

In nearby Paradise, threatened twice this year by encroaching forest fires, Stan Thompson, an assistant governor of District 5160, helped secure 1,560 masks for the town after officials ran out.

Long after the wildfires are contained, they will continue to affect residents' health. Fine said smoke from burning forests carries particulate matter such as dust and soot, some of it very fine, which has residual effects when it enters the respiratory system. The matter eventually builds up in the lungs, posing risks for everyone, but especially people with breathing problems such as asthma.

The weather patterns that have hampered firefighting efforts are also worsening the air quality. Inversion layers have trapped smoke close to the ground, keeping out cooler breezes that would otherwise clear it out.

"We are told high pressure -- that which makes inversion layers -- will lift in days ahead, allowing in cooler breezes with higher humidity," said William Short, an assistant governor of District 5180. "We are told, however, breezes could stir up hot spots and fan flames to a new frenzy. We pray for a little of the former and none of the latter."

DOT Harbors Division, in partnership with members of the Hawai'i Harbors User Group, has developed a system-wide harbor modernization plan which will implement harbor infrastructure improvements to address projected increases in ocean transportation of cargo and passengers through the year 2030.

The Big Island of Hawai'i has two commercial harbors, Hilo and Kawaihae. Hilo is the island's busier port handling cargo and passengers. Kawaihae on the island's northwest side is served by Matson and Young Brothers, as well as bulk barges. It is also the harbor used to ship Big Island cattle to market. The Big Island has experienced a population growth of 31.5 percent increase in the last 15 years. The plan includes the following projects:

- Dredging, construction of a new pier and inter-island cargo handling yard through a new Pier 4 barge terminal in Hilo
- Acquisition of property to establish a third harbor access via Kumao Street which will allow for traffic separation between commercial and cruise ship activity
- Expansion of barge and terminal improvements at Pier 2 at Kawaihae Harbor
- A southern extension of Pier 2 to provide additional overseas operational area at Kawaihae Harbor
- Construction of a multi-use Pier 4 at Kawaihae Harbor
- Site improvements to allow the development of liquid bulk storage facilities at Kawaihae Harbor



A Club "Avenue of Service" Update: Community Service

The Community Service Committee awarded two Community Service grants in July. The first grant was awarded to the Ocean View Seniors Club in the amount of \$350.00 for a portable SO2 monitor. The Ocean View area is subject to ongoing inundation of vog due to its proximity to Kilauea Volcano and the ongoing eruptive cycle. Having a monitor to determine the amount of sulfur dioxide in the air will inform the clients and members of potential health threatening episodes, and having the monitor portable would enable the members to move to an area unaffected by extreme high levels of this hazardous and otherwise undetectable gas.

A second grant in the amount of \$500.00 has been awarded to Na Leo O Hawaii, Inc., a 501c.3 community organization, to help with their 4th annual Big Island Youth Video Contest. The contest¹s aims are twofold; one is to encourage youth to send a message about their concerns through the creative and powerful medium of video and secondly, to teach youth a skill that will enhance their lives. Na Leo O Hawaii will be offering free video training classes

to youth participating in the 2009 contest. The contest is open to elementary, middle, high school and college students of the Big Island.

This Week's Program - Dr. Randall Roth, Author and UH Professor



Dr. Roth is a professor at the University of Hawaii specializing in taxation, trusts and estates, nonprofit organizations, and professional responsibility. He is best known as the author of The Price of Paradise and co-author of Broken Trust.

He received his BS, summa cum laude, Regis College, 1970; JD, University of Denver, 1974; and LLM, University of Miami, 1975. He served as President of the Hawai`i State Bar Association in 1999, and prior to that was President of the Hawai`i Justice Foundation, Hawai`i Institute for Continuing Legal Education and Hawai`i Estate Planning Council.

In 2003 he took a leave from the university to serve as senior policy advisor to Governor Linda Lingle during her first year in office. Professor Roth has been a member of the faculty

at three law schools and was named Professor of the Year at all three.

In 1992 and 1993 Professor Roth co-authored and edited, <u>The Price of Paradise</u>, which was later translated and published in Japan. From 1993 to 1998 he hosted a weekly live talk show on Hawaii Public Radio.

In 2006 Professor Roth and senior federal district court judge Samuel King wrote <u>Broken Trust: Greed, Management and Political Manipulation at America's Largest Charitable Trust,</u> which in 2007 received three awards from the Hawaii Book Publishers Association, including "Book of the Year."

Sue Grose is a volunteer board member of the organization, and will be sharing more information with us at this week's meeting.







October is Vocational Service Month

If you had the opportunity to help reduce unemployment, stimulate the local economy, or inspire young people toward successful, productive careers - all while applying and developing your own vocational skills - would you jump at the chance? As a Rotarian driven by the ideal of service, you hold the power to effect that sort of meaningful, positive change in your community through Vocational Service.

According to United Nations figures, we live in an era in which one out of 10 people of working age can't find a job that pays a decent wage. In the schools, many young people have no understanding of how education affects their chances for success in the workforce. 



Eight-year-old Virginia O'Hanlon wrote a letter to the editor of New York's Sun, and the quick response was printed as an unsigned editorial Sept. 21, 1897.

"DEAR EDITOR: I am 8 years old. "Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. "Papa says, 'If you see it in THE SUN it's so.' "Please tell me the truth; is there a Santa Claus? "VIRGINIA O'HANLON. "115 WEST NINETY-FIFTH STREET."

VIRGINIA, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except [what] they see. They think that nothing can be which is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, Virginia, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours man is a mere insect, an ant, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole of truth and knowledge.

Yes, VIRGINIA, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! how dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no VIRGINIAS. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We should have no enjoyment, except in sense and sight. The eternal light with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

Not believe in Santa Claus! You might as well not believe in fairies! You might get your papa to hire men to watch in all the chimneys on Christmas Eve to catch Santa Claus, but even if they did not see Santa Claus coming down, what would that prove? Nobody sees Santa Claus, but that is no sign that there is no Santa Claus. The most real things in the world are those that neither children nor men can see. Did you ever see fairies dancing on the lawn? Of course not, but that's no proof that they are not there. Nobody can conceive or imagine all the wonders there are unseen and unseeable in the world.

You may tear apart the baby's rattle and see what makes the noise inside, but there is a veil covering the unseen world which not the strongest man, nor even the united strength of all the strongest men that ever lived, could tear apart. Only faith, fancy, poetry, love, romance, can push aside that curtain and view and picture the supernal beauty and glory beyond. Is it all real? Ah, VIRGINIA, in all this world there is nothing else real and abiding.

No Santa Claus! Thank God! he lives, and he lives forever. A thousand years from now, Virginia, nay, ten times ten thousand years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood.



This Week's Program: Filmmaker Alex Farnham



"I have a deep passion for filmmaking and I try to do my best with every project. My goal is to one day make a film that changes peoples' lives in a profound way. I've been making films since I was 12. I started with random humorous shorts and occasional school projects. My freshman year of HS, the local YMCA hired me to cover The International Pacific Cup of Freediving. I filmed and edited the entire event, creating a 30 minute piece, which was shown at the closing night awards ceremony. The film was seen by hundreds of people from all around the world, and received a standing ovation. The film sold over a hundred copies.

My work has been shown on local and national television. In 2004 I directed and stared in my first HD project, which was transferred to film and shown in local theaters. I've

also worked on large-scale concerts as a cameraman. I have been hired to film weddings, community plays and a newsworthy promotional piece for Deep Sea Water International.

My creative influences are the people and events that surround me. I find that a well made film stimulates my creativity, so when I watch a movie I consider it on many different levels. 

From Rotary Outbound Exchange Student Lauren Holdcroft:

My Year In Argentina

It all started...well, actually I don't quite know when it started. I have been obsessed with the idea of spending one of my high school years in another country as a Rotary Exchange Student for as long as I can remember. Normally, exchanges are done in the Junior or Senior year, but I couldn't wait. I decided to go after my Freshman year at HPA. On August 14, 2008, I got on a plane with a year of Spanish under my belt, 2 suitcases, my blue Rotary jacket, and, of course my rubber slippers. I should have been scared, but at that point the only thing that I could feel was anticipation. It ran through my blood like electricity, making the three seven hour plane flights, and the 5 hour layover in Miami almost unbearable. Then I touched down in Buenos Aires. Outside I met my Rotary Club Counselor, and the first thing he said to me was 'Welcome!' I stuttered out a few words, my first in almost 2 days, and, right then, the anticipation puddled in a pool at my feet, left behind as I walked out into the freezing air. I had arrived.

The three hours to General Madariaga, the town where I would be for the next year of my life, were endless. It felt like days that we were driving along the flat Argentinean countryside. My Spanish was, sorry to say, horrible, and in those first few weeks I developed a habit of nodding and agreeing with whatever I was told. I was put in the local school, in a class full of kids my age and grade, but so different at the same time. Those first few weeks of school, everyone blurred into everyone else, and I counted 'friends' as those people who said hi to me. I learned how to say 'I don't understand', which helped, and after a few more weeks, I could understand questions asked of me almost all the time.

Now, 6 months after that first day, I hardly recognize myself. I was a girl who, not only knew nothing of Spanish, but also nothing of an entire culture. These days, I walk to school myself, drink maté (traditional tea) with my grandparents, (and know how to prepare it), have made a group of friends who mean the world to me, understand me, and, more importantly, know me not as 'the foreign girl who speaks English', but as 'Lauren, our friend from Hawaii'. Most importantly, I have been integrated into a culture so different from my own almost seamlessly, and sometimes I can't help but wonder, is the difference that profound between learning because you need to, to pass a test, and learning because you want to, so that you can talk with the people around you and essentially, survive?

With only 4 months left of my exchange, I feel I have learned more than about this country than I ever could have in a classroom. This experience has opened my eyes to everything around me. It has humbled me immensely, but also made me so much stronger and so much more confident as a person. It has made me rethink who I am, and who I will continue to be- after high school and further along. This hasn't just been one year abroad. It is a gift that I will use for the rest of my life. I am really grateful that Rotary provides such a great opportunity for teens to experience the world.


