

Medial Aid to Haiti - A volunteer's Story Dr. Lonny Higgins

Dr. Higgins has recently returned from several weeks of volunteer work in Haiti, where she, her daughter and son-in-law, along with several other volunteers worked in a small clinic assisting as needed and teaching the local people how to continue treatment so wounds would heal.

Dr. Lonny Higgins graduated from Wellesley College in 1969 with a BA in Philosophy. She received her MD from Tufts University School of Medicine where she was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha National Honor Medical Society. She completed her Ob/ Gyn residency at Tufts University and is Board Certified and a Fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists.

Following her residency, she and her husband and two young children spent five years living and traveling aboard an 82-foot gaff rigged schooner providing volunteer medical services in the Caribbean, Central America, and the South Pacific. During these years, she worked as a Senior Registrar in Obstetrics and Gynecology at National Women's Hospital in Auckland, New Zealand.

In 1984, Dr. Higgins and her husband settled in Hawaii and established Marimed Foundation, a non-profit organization that provided primary health care and training in Micronesia in the 1980s and early 90's and today is the largest provider of residential behavioral health care services to special needs adolescents in Hawaii. In the late 1980's, while serving as volunteer Medical Director for Marimed Foundation, she also served as Assistant Professor in the Department of Ob/Gyn at the University of Hawaii's John A. Burns School of Medicine and was Assistant Director of Perinatal Medicine at Kapiolani Medical Center for Women and Children.

In 1989 she co-founded Pali Women's Health Center, which provides comprehensive women's health care services on windward Oahu. By the mid 1990's, Dr. Higgins' two older children had left home for college, and she found herself wanting to have another child. Because of her age, she and her husband turned to assisted reproductive technologies (ART), and with the help of an ovum donor, Dr. Higgins became pregnant. Shortly after the birth of their third child in 1996, she retired from clinical practice and moved to the Big Island where she and her husband now live on their farm, along with their youngest son, three horses, 70 sheep, two dogs, and a cat.




Fire Chief Darryl Oliveira

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Laura Varney, Executive Director Hospice of Kona

Originating in England, hospice care evolved into a popular concept in the United States in the mid 1970s. Since then, more than 2,900 U. S. Hospice programs of care for the terminally ill have been established.

Attending the dying in a palliative (comfort) rather than a curative manner resulted in rapid growth of the hospice movement. Hospice offers terminally ill patients the hope of comfort and death with dignity. U. S. Congress designated November as National Hospice Month, demonstrating again that hospice now receives national recognition.

Hospice of Kona was organized in 1985 after the Rector of Christ Episcopal Church died of cancer. A member of his congregation, Sandol Stoddard, who authored The Hospice Movement, brought Dr. William Lamers from California to instruct on Hospice Care. A committee of dedicated volunteers from Christ Church organized, and Hospice of Kona was begun.

By 1987 Hospice began seeing patients. Staffed by volunteers, Hospice of Kona relied on donations and grants. In 1992 Hospice became Medicare Certified to provide hospice care to patients meeting the eligibility requirements of the Medicare Hospice Benefit. Hospice of Kona also contracts with most commercial insurance companies that offer the Hospice Benefit. Patients are accepted solely on the basis of medical need and not on the basis of their ability to pay.

In 1994 Bruno J Keith donated property on Palani Road to Hospice of Kona. This location served as offices for the staff until 2006 when the property was sold and the staff was relocated to a newly renovated office space in Kealakekua

At the end of 2007 the Community Services Center opened in the heart of Kailua Kona and serves as our Volunteer, Bereavement, Social Services and Administrative head-quarters as well as the headquarters for our clinical team. Hospice of Kona currently employs 24 very passionate professionals to provide programs & services to the Kona Community.



THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Alex Frost, County of Hawaii R&D Dept **Green Economy Report**

In September 2010, Dept. R&D Resource Center published the Island of Hawai'i Green Economy Report, a first county level snapshot on the State of the Island Green Economy. The report confirms investment in a green economy is essential to end fossil fuel dependence and defined "Green Economy" as made up of businesses and people that provide products, services and knowledge related to areas such as: renewable energy and fuel; sustainable agriculture; green construction and energy efficiency; and environmental conservation and pollution mitigation. Some of the key find-

- Three hundred and eighty two (382) private, public and community organizations are working to reduce Hawaii Island's dependence on Green Investment imported fossil fuel.
- Approximately \$388 million was marked for energy related projects state-wide (County of Hawaii did not receive any state funding via Hawaii Clean Energy Initiative).

Rotary Club of Kona History

The Rotary Club of Kona was chartered as West Hawaii's first Rotary Club on February 7, 1948, through the sponsorship of the Rotary Club of Hilo. The Rotary Club of Kona was the eighth club to be formed within District 5000 (then District 500) in the State of Hawaii.

When first chartered, the Club's territorial boundaries extended 50 miles in three directions from Kailua-Kona, and bordered the Pacific Ocean on its West side. Subsequently, with the addition of two more Rotary clubs in West Hawaii, the Kona Club's area now is limited to North Kona and the northern part of South Kona.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Tom Brown, County of Hawaii Mass Transit Administrator

Tom Brown, Administrator of the Mass Transit Division of the County of Hawaii, will join us today and bring us up to date on the County's Transportation issues.

Our tri-club project now totaling 45 ShelterBoxes

100 ShelterBoxes have been requested for each of the following five cities: Miyako, Yamadamachi, Kamaishi, Rikuzentakata and Ofunato.Local government authorities in Japans Iwate Prefecture have requested 500 ShelterBoxes to provide emergency shelter and lifesaving supplies for families who lost their homes in last week's tsunami.

The request came via the local Rotary district and is initially for 100 ShelterBoxes for each of the following five cities: Miyako, Yamadamachi, Kamaishi, Rikuzentakata and Ofunato. The ShelterBox Response Team (SRT) operating in the country are working in cooperation with the British Embassy, British military personnel and the US military to overcome the logistical challenges they are facing. It is a seven-hour journey by road from Tokyo to the lwate Prefecture and with fuel shortages, heavy snow, freezing temperatures and the ongoing nuclear situation there are a range of obstacles to overcome in order to ensure aid reaches the families who need it most.

Every disaster is different but this one is certainly posing a unique set of circumstances for us to deal with, said SRT member and ShelterBox International Director Lasse Petersen who has been in Japan since last Saturday. We mobilized on day one because we knew there would be a need for the provision of emergency shelter. The specific needs request means we can now begin our distribution and we continue to be ready to respond in whatever capacity is required from us.
