Local News Surfs Up Big Island

Surfers Rejoice. The Eddie is a Go. After days of massive waves in Hawaii, some reaching 50 feet high and washing over roads and homes, organizers gave the nod Thursday morning to begin the Eddie Aikau big-wave surfing competition.

Organizers of the rarely-held and invitation-only Eddie Aikau contest on Oahu's North Shore said the waves met the requirements of being 40-feet tall with sustained swells that lasted long enough to run multiple heats. In more than 30 years, those conditions have only been met nine times, including Thursday. The event was last held in 2009.



On the big Island surf conditions are similar with 60ft faces on the north shore of the big island.

Back on the Kona side of life the surf is expected to only reach 15 to 25ft. Enough that local beaches Laaloa and Banyons are expected to remain closed Thursday through Friday as the swells continue to grow.



Local News Kīlauea Rests, Mauna Loa Stirs



After a spectacular display of volcanic activity that hasn't been seen for over 50 years, Kilauea has finally settled down to what the USGS Hawaiian Volcano Observation states as "normal" seismic deformation.

Meanwhile, the USGS Hawaiian Volcano Observatory's improved seismic network began to detect increasingly frequent, small earthquakes on Mauna Loa as early as 2013.

Renewed inflation of the volcano was detected by HVO's GPS network and also with Interferometric Synthetic Aperture Radar (InSAR) in 2014. Based on the elevated rates of earthquakes

and persistent inflation, the Volcano Alert Level for Mauna Loa was elevated from Normal to Advisory on September 15, 2015.

Unrest at Mauna Loa is not following a simple script. This is why, at this point in time, it is not possible to forecast with certainty if or when the volcano will erupt as a result of this unrest.

The Hawaiian Volcano Observatory continues to closely monitor Mauna Loa and is developing new tools to help our response to an eruption—should one occur.





Travel Alert Issued To Hawaii Island Due To Rapid Ohia Death

HILO, Hawaii – The State of Hawaii has issued a travel alert in advance of the upcoming Merrie Monarch hula festival, warning visitors about the quarantine restrictions on the transport of 'ōhi'a from Hawaii Island due to a serious plant disease called Rapid Ohia Death, or ROD, which is devastating the native forests on that island.

ROD was first noticed in 2010 in Puna and to date over 34,000 acres of 'ōhi'a forest are currently infected. It is not known how the disease entered the state or where it came from, and so far the disease has not been found on other islands.

The Department Of Agriculture urges everyone to take the necessary precautions to help us preserve one of Hawaii's most precious cultural and natural resources.

The Cost of Paradise: Big Island Air Quality Among the State's Worst

Honolulu ranked as one of the country's cleanest cities, as far as air quality, in a recent report release by the American Lung Association. However Hawai'i County received the lowest grade out of all of the state's counties with a C for short-term particle pollution and a failing

Rotary



grade for year-round particle pollution. Kaua'i received an "A" grade for short-term particle pollution, while Maui received a "B" grade for the same.

"Hawai'i's air quality conditions are affected by our volcano", said Kim Nguyen, Executive Director of the American Lung Association in Hawai'i, who noted that vog is an ongoing health issue for many Hawai'i residents and visitors. While Hawai'i isn't unique as the report found that more than half of people in the U.S. live in counties that have unhealthy levels of either ozone or particle pollution, totaling 166 million Americans. 

Governor David Ige recognized the efforts of the Hawai'i State Legislature at a press conference on Wednesday, noting his appreciation for its focus on setting the policy direction and making appropriations for the state.

"Disagreements are inevitable and healthy debate strengthens the end product," Governor Ige said.

The session earned a B grade, according to the governor who made mention

of issues that still need to be looked at and bills that need to undergo careful consideration.

Governor Ige highlighted several bills passed through legislation during the session, including SB3126, relating to the allowance of an emergency appropriation for air conditioning in schools. A priority that placed high in the governor's agenda.

Improving health care, and resource management were additional highlights.

"Mahalo to the state's directors and deputies who have kept the state running during this legislative session," Governor Ige closed.

Young Nēnē Geese Take Their Initial Flights

Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park is seeing reappearances of nēnē geese after the state birds were less visible during the fall and winter. During the year's latter seasons, the nēnē hunker down to nest, raise goslings, and grow a new set of flight feathers.

Now, park officials say the geese are beginning to flock and young-



er nēnē are taking their first flights. Last Saturday, two young fledglings were killed on Crater Rim Drive, between Kilauea Overlook and Jaggar Museum. The young birds, which were around six months old, were discovered by a park ranger.

In 1952, only 30 birds remained statewide. HVNP began efforts to recover the species in the 1970s. The Nēnē Recovery Program continues today, and more than 250 birds thrive in the park from sea level to around 8,000 feet. More than 2,500 nēnē exist statewide.Wild nēnē are the world's rarest goose. They are only found in Hawai'i and the last survivor of several other endemic geese.

Time & Place Set For First Hilo TMT Contested Case Conference

HILO, Hawaii – The next pre-hearing conference on the upcoming Thirty Meter Telescope contested case will be held on Friday, June 17, 2016 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the County Council Chambers of the Hawaii County Building in Hilo.

"As public health professionals," Taualii and Cooper stated in their request, "we are concerned in protecting the health of Native Hawaiians by stopping the desecration of Mauna Kea. Building the TMT on Mauna Kea has a negative health impact on Native Hawaiian communities. The TMT



has a harmful impact on the cultural practices associated with Mauna Kea. We have data presenting that doing traditional practices is a protective factor against high distress in Aboriginal/Indigenous People. This can be correlated with how the TMT will obstruct cultural practices for Native Hawaiians, which will lead to high distress in the communities."

Judge Riki May Amano says following the hearings on June 17, 2016, there will be a second prehearing conference with counsels and unrepresented parties, if any, to discuss further scheduling. Everyone should have their calendars with them, Amano wrote.
