A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I am overcome with immense gratitude as I share the extraordinary impact your generosity has had on our mission and the communities we serve. Together, we've accomplished incredible feats and I'm thrilled to share the progress we made this year.

The theme for this year's progress report resonates deeply with your actions:

"See the Difference, Be the Difference." You are the embodiment of this theme—
someone who took action and transformed lives through kindness. Whether you funded
a full well, initiated a fundraising campaign, invited friends and family to contribute, or
donated to our operations, your impact has been profound. Your contributions,
regardless of their size or designation, are instrumental in enabling us to continue our
work and make tangible differences in the lives of those in need.

In 2022, thanks to you, a staggering total of 117 wells were funded. These wells are more than a source of clean water—they represent hope, progress and powerful change. Their existence means that girls can attend school without worrying about water collection, women can engage in income-generating activities, and children lead healthier lives.

Moreover, amidst the challenges posed by the recent conflict in Ethiopia, donor support allowed us to respond effectively and efficiently. We received critical funding to address damaged wells. As a result, 238 wells were rehabilitated in the Tigray region of Ethiopia with ongoing efforts to restore more wells soon. These rehabilitation efforts hold immense significance as they enable families to rebuild their lives and return to their homes without the burden of walking long distances to reach contaminated water.

These wells mean restored hope and dignity for communities facing adversity.

In addition, a recent grant of \$350,000 from an anonymous donor allowed us to address water access in rural health clinics in southern Ethiopia, which has transformed the landscape of healthcare in these underserved regions. This grant enabled us to provide clean water, and essential facilities such as flushing toilets, showers and sinks, to 34 rural health clinics. The importance of clean water in healthcare settings cannot be overstated. Now, new mothers have access to a shower after giving birth, and overall healthcare for newborns and patients has vastly improved.



At Water to Thrive, providing clean water is the cornerstone of our existence. However, the continuity of our efforts remains a paramount concern. Ensuring the continuity of our work into the future is crucial. To address this, we've placed a strong emphasis on sustainability culminating in the establishment of an endowment fund. I'm delighted to share that the endowment has reached \$700,000 toward our \$1 million goal! This initiative is part of our plan to provide clean water for another 15 years and beyond.

Reflecting on the incredible accomplishments of this past year fills me with gratitude, not just from myself or our small staff, but from our dedicated board of directors and, most importantly, from every person whose life has been transformed. Your generosity has alleviated burdens, made life easier and fulfilled one of the most basic human needs—access to clean water!

SUSTAINABLE SOLUTIONS



WHERE WE WORK

We work in East Africa, in Ethiopia, Uganda and Tanzania. By focusing our work in the same geographical area, we are able to maximize our efficiency. The need is great in this area-in sub-Saharan Africa, 40% of people lack access to clean water. We work in rural areas as they are the most isolated from water.



OUR PARTNERS

We work with local partners who are experts in water project construction. These partners have the ability to work with local government, and since they know the language and culture of the communities we serve, they are able to mobilize communities and prepare them for their new well.



ON THE GROUND

Gashaw Simeneh, our Project Manager, lives in Ethiopia, and travels to all three countries to oversee all of our water projects. He conducts regular site visits and sends us progress reports during the construction process, so that our partners are held accountable for the work of building wells.



WELL OWNERSHIP

Communities are actively involved in the process of building a well, from choosing a location to construction to ongoing maintenance. We want communities to take ownership of their well. The community selects a Water Committee, who establishes hours of operation for the well and manages a repair fund.



EMPOWERMENT

Each Water Committee is locally-elected and made up of at least 50% women. Since women are the primary water collectors in East Africa, we ensure that they are included in making important decisions about the well. Plus, research shows that wells implemented with the support of women are more sustainable.



EDUCATION

Along with their well, every community receives comprehensive water, sanitation and hygiene training, to learn about water contamination, how to prevent waterborne diseases and the importance of handwashing. The Water Committees are trained on how to operate and maintain each well.

Inhari is a mother of six living in Ethiopia. She gained access to clean water for the first time this year.

Before the well:

I know that this water is making our people sick. Many people in our village have been ill with Giardia, but we have no choice. I worry for my children. I am hopeful now that I know a well really is coming, and we will be free from this burden and constant worry.

After the well:

I am so grateful to the donors of this well. May God bless you all; we are now healthy because of this precious gift of clean water. Thank you for considering us and for changing our lives!





Rohobot is a seven-year-old living in Ethiopia. She gained access to clean water for the first time this year.

Before the well:

I did not know we were receiving a well.
I have been traveling to get water a few times a day. The water makes us sick, but we have no other option.

After the well:

Everything has changed, and we are very happy that we have clean drinking water. May God bless all those who funded and built the water project for us. Drinking clean water has saved us from getting sick. Thank you very much —now we have a healthy life.

IMPACT


We launched an Endowment Fund, so donors can invest in our future, and we can build wells for years to come.
